Named after Brigadier General Carlos M. De Alvear, a young friend of General San Martín and hero in the war against Brazil. Only seven blocks long, Alvear Avenue stands out by the harmonious combination of the heights of its buildings.

It goes from Recoleta to Carlos Pellegrini Square towards the city center. Years ago the oldest eclectic residences of the city were located around Alvear Avenue, many of which were demolished as a result of land speculation prices, leaving only a few as a testimony of a splendorous past.
