Avenida de Mayo (15)



The avenue of the Spanish community par excellence, it was enlarged in the late nineteenth century under the influence of Hausmann's town planning major reforms in Paris. The Avenida de Mayo is a great symbolic corridor that connects two of the main power centers in democracy: the

Presidential House or Casa Rosada and Congress. It is characterized by the harmony in the height of its buildings which shows the first examples of modern styles: Art Nouveau, Catalan Modernism, Art Deco and Romanic buildings and the unclassifiable Barolo Palace with its influence from Hindu style.
