SOUTHERN RIVERSIDE AVENUE AND PARK

Costanera Sur

This riverside avenue and park were inaugurated in 1918, at the height of the Buenos Aires Belle Epoque, as a public recreational area. Those were the years when progress and prosperity seemed like they would last forever and Le Corbusier is supposed to have designed an artificial island with 600 feet tall skyscrapers. After having been abandoned for more than 50 years, the famous monuments have been restored and this Riverside area is now an Ecological Reserve area, a bird watching reservation and a public recreational area for the practice of yoga, meditation and various athletic disciplines.


